

As you read your novel, you will be writing personal responses in this journal. Fill out your journal **as you read**; otherwise, you will forget what you wanted to write.

You have three journal entries due per week: one every Monday, one every Wednesday, and one every Friday.

Be thoughtful and meaningful in your responses. Please fill up every line – if you have blank lines, you have not adequately answered the writing prompt.

All responses should be in complete sentences and written in your neatest print or cursive.

When choosing one of three journal prompts, please highlight or circle the prompt you are choosing.

There are no right or wrong answers – just relevant and complete answers or irrelevant and incomplete answers! With this in mind, each page of your journal will be evaluated according to the following rubric:

- **4** ⇒ **Complete** (all answers are relevant, thoughtful, & meaningful and all lines are filled)
- 3 ⇒ Mostly complete (all answers are relevant, thoughtful, & meaningful and most lines are filled)
- 2 ⇒ Somewhat complete (not all answers are relevant, thoughtful, & meaningful and/or only about half of the lines are filled)
- 1 ⇒ Started, but not even half completed (answers are minimal, with very little thought or relevance and/or most lines are blank)
- 0 ⇒ Page is entirely blank or the questions are restated, but that is the only writing on the page

#### How to finish your novel and your journal at the same time:

You have 12 journal pages (pages 8-19).

Divide the total number of pages in your novel by 12. This is the number of pages you should read each time you are going to complete a journal page.

Remember, you have a journal page due every Monday, every Wednesday, and every Friday. Plan your time wisely so you are reading an adequate number of pages each time you fill out a journal response.

Joey is sensitive when he reflects on his actions. Sometimes he has regrets, such as when he was running with scissors and he accidentally hurt a classmate. Joey is funny when he ends up in crazy situations. For example, he swallowed his house key and he got his finger stuck in a pencil sharpener. I can't wait to learn more about Joey's adventures!
