Bena Kallick, Ph. Dr. Kallick is well known nationally, as well as, internationally for her work in curriculum, instruction and assessment with an emphasis on organizational change. She has co-authored several scholarly works for the Association of Supervisors of Curriculum Development-ASCD) on Assessment in the Learning Organization (ASCD, 1998), the Habits of Mind series (ASCD, 2000), Strategies for Self-Directed Learning (Corwin Press, 2004), Learning and Leading with Habits of Mind (ASCD, 2008), Habits of Mind Across the Curriculum (ASCD, 2009) and Using Curriculum Mapping and Assessment to Improve Student Learning (Corwin Press, 2009). Her works have also been translated into Dutch, Chinese, Italian, Hebrew, Arabic, and Spanish.
