8 9	II. DEFINITIONS	For the purpose of this policy "medication" shall include all medicines, controlled and over-the-counter, prescribed by a physician. "Asthma inhaler"	
1 0		means a prescribed device used for the self-administration of short-acting,	
11		metered doses of prescribed medication to treat an acute asthma attack.	
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13	III. POLICY	Medication Prescribed by the Family Health Care Provider - Before any	
14		prescribed medication may be administered to any student by district	
15		personnel or self-administered by a student during school hours or school	
.6		sponsored activities, the Board requires a written order from a physician and	
7		written authorization from a parent or legal guardian on the school district	
.8		form which outlines the district medication guidelines. The order from the	
9		physician must include the following:	
20		the name of the student	
21		the name of the medication & any known medication allergies	
2		• the dosage of the medication and the route of administration	
3		• the time (or frequency) the medication is to be administered	
4 5		• the name, address, and phone number of the prescribing physician is clearly stated on the order

27		The physician should also indicate any special circumstances under which the	
28		medication may be administered, any possible side effects of the medication,	
9		the diagnosis or condition for which the medication is being prescribed and	
0		the expected duration of the medical regime. In the case of an Asthma inhaler,	
51		the physician shall clearly indicate that the student is qualified and able to	
2		self-administer the medication.

2		Emergency Medications – Administration of epinephrine by non-nurse	2
3		personnel in emergency circumstances shall be permitted when such	3
4		personnel are appropriately trained by the responsible school nurse and when	4
5		administration otherwise complies with guidelines of the Pennsylvania	5
6		Department of Health and the State Board of Nursing.	6
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8		Request for Long-Term Administration of Medications - Request for the	8
9		long term administration of medications must be renewed at the beginning	9
10		of each school year. Any change in the dosage or frequency of a long-term	10
11		medication must be documented in writing by the prescribing physician and	11
12		will constitute a new order. If the prescribing physician wishes to discontinue	12
13		a long-term medication, he/she must state such in writing.	13
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15		Approved Employees to Administer Medication - All medications must be	15
16		administered in the building health suite by one of the following:	16
17		• the certified school nurse, RN, LPN, or	17
18		• the student, when the physician so directs by written order and when	18
19		self-administration otherwise complies with the guidelines of the	19
20		Pennsylvania Department of Health and the State Board of Nursing.	20
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22		If the physician order states that a student may carry and self-administer an	22
23		asthma inhaler or medication to treat anaphylaxis, the student must	23
24		demonstrate the capability for self-administration and for responsible	24
25		behavior in the use thereof and the student must notify the school nurse, the	25
26		principal or the principal's designee immediately following each use of	26
27		the emergency medication.	27
