1	PURPOSE	The administration of medical treatments in the school setting has become	1
2		more frequent within the past decade. Children with developmental	2
3		disabilities, physical handicaps, and chronic disabling conditions (such as	3
4		asthma, cystic fibrosis or diabetes) may require care and health services which	4
5		go beyond the traditional health practice. Treatments given during school	5
6		hours should be those which cannot be delayed until non school hours and	6
7		are required by the student in order to maintain his/her health status.	7

9	DEFINITION	Treatments include any medical procedure necessary to maintain the	9

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14	ADMINISTRATION	Before any medical treatment is instituted in the school setting by district	14
15		personnel, the Board requires a written order from a physician and written	15
16		authorization from a parent or guardian on the school district authorization	16
17		form which outlines the district's treatment guidelines. The order from the	17
18		physician must include:	18
19		• the name of the student.	19
20		• the treatment being ordered.	20
21		• the diagnosis and reason for the treatment.	21
22		• the specific instructions regarding the procedure (a time schedule for the	22
23		treatment, the duration of the treatment to be administered in school,	23
24		contraindications and possible complications).	24
25		• any curtailment of specific school activities such as physical education,	25
26		sports, technology education classes, science labs, etc.	26
27		• the name, address and phone number of the prescribing physician.	27

30		The parent or guardian of the student receiving medical treatments in the	30
31		school setting is responsible for the supply, maintenance and delivery of all	31
32		equipment necessary for providing such care. Any unused supplies will be	32
33		returned to the parent or guardian.	33

22		The certified school nurse will maintain records of all physician orders for the	22
23		administration of medical treatments in the school setting as well as the	23
24		parental authorization for those treatments. The certified school nurse will	24
