We have experienced a dramatic increase in mid-day requests for changes in transportation plans. If a **true emergency** occurs in the day, we will do our best to accommodate the request. Otherwise,

children are to ride their assigned bus to and from school. They may not change buses in order to visit friends or go to after-school meetings.

- Parents are requested not to ask for exceptions.
- In case of an EMERGENCY, send a note with your child IN THE MORNING and a decision will be made by the Principal.

If there is **any** change in a student's dismissal plan, written permission **must** be received from the parent/guardian. If your child is going home with another child **a note must be received by that parent as well.**



Dear Miller Families,

On behalf of our entire staff, Happy Holidays and Happy New Year! I would like to clarify and remind you of two issues at this point in our school year.

As the cold weather is now upon us, some parents have asked if and when students go outside for recess. Fresh air and exercise

are important to children, so unless it's bitterly cold (temperatures and/or wind child below 20 degrees), or if it is raining/snowing at the time of recess, we will be going outside. Children should be prepared each day with hats, gloves/mittens, and a warm coat to wear outside. Your cooperation and support of this matter is greatly appreciated. If your child is in need of a coat, please contact me and I will remedy this confidentially.

An absence note is <u>always</u> required when a child returns to school after an absence. The note should be sent to the teacher, be specific concerning the reason, and specify the date(s) of absence. In cases of excessive absences, school authorities may request a doctor's certificate for justification.




