Dear Neshaminy Parents and Guardians,

This letter provides detailed information regarding the Pennsylvania System of School Assessment (PSSA) as well as the required opt out procedures. The content of this letter is lengthy, but necessary in order to provide the required information.

## **PSSA Participation:**

The PSSA is the Pennsylvania Department of Education's (PDE) annual standards-based assessment used to measure a student's attainment of the Pennsylvania Academic Standards in English-Language Arts (ELA), Mathematics, and Science.

Any student who is enrolled in grades 3 through 8 during the **current** 2021-2022 school year will be automatically rostered to take the designated PSSAs for his or her specific grade this April.

The PSSAs will be administered online in your child's school building and students will use their district issued 1:1 Chromebook to complete the assessment(s). Each assessment will be administered on the dates outlined on the schedule below. Specific assessment schedules regarding the times of each assessment will be provided by your child's school principal.

## **PSSA Opt-Out Procedures:**

Chapter 4 of Title 22 of the Pa. Code (22 Pa. code 4.4) provides for the right of any parent/guardian to excuse his/her child from the state assessment if, upon inspection of the testing materials, he/she finds the assessment to conflict with his/her religious beliefs. This is the only basis for a parent/guardian to excuse his or her child from the statewide assessments.

Parents and guardians may review the PSSA if they believe they may be in conflict with their religious beliefs by making arrangements with the School Principal once the exams arrive in the school building. All assessments are scheduled to arrive in District the week of April 11, 2022. Parents and Guardians must sign the Parent Confidentiality Agreement prior to examining test materials. A copy of this agreement will be maintained at the school.

Finally, if you choose to opt your child out of taking one or more of the Pennsylvania System of School Assessments, if after reviewing the test parents/guardians find the test to be in conflict with their religious beliefs and wish their student(s) to be excused from the test, parents/guardians must provide

written request that states this to the District Assessment Coordinator, Mr. David Geanette at [dgeanette@neshaminy.org](mailto:dgeanette@neshaminy.org). Please note, parents must submit a separate request for each child you are requesting to be excluded.
