

CARES Behaviors

*During the first weeks of school the class has been discussing the behaviors that we feel are important in a classroom and at school. **CARES** has become the acronym upon which we have based *ALL* expected behaviors at Schweitzer Elementary:

Cooperation

Attitude (positive attitude)

Respect

Empathy

Safety

Throughout the first several weeks of school a significant amount of class time has been spent discussing and modeling appropriate **CARES** behaviors. For example, students know that listening to others when they are speaking is a way to demonstrate **RESPECT**.

Behavioral Feedback

We use a Clip Chart to promote positive behavior. Students that demonstrate positive behavior will "clip up" on the chart. Students that demonstrate inappropriate behavior will "clip down" on the chart. Each student has the opportunity to continually improve their behavior throughout the day. Therefore, if they clip down at any point during the day, they have the opportunity to correct that behavior and clip back up! Every day all students begin on "Ready to Learn". We use the following terms on our Clip Chart:

- Outstanding
- Great Job
- Good Day
- Ready to Learn
- Think About It
- Teacher Choice
- Parent Contact

Students who have difficulty demonstrating the appropriate behaviors will be receive a Behavior Referral to the principal. Consequences are determined based on the severity of the behavior.

Positive Reinforcement

In addition to the positive reinforcements that are occurring throughout our school as components of our CARES/SWPBS program, students who end the day on "Ready to Learn" or above will receive hole punches on their "credit card". When credit cards are full, students will have the opportunity to go to the treasure chest. Students that consistently end their day at "Good Day" or above will receive a CARES sticker for consistently demonstrating appropriate behavior. As always, students will continue to receive CARES stickers for exceptional behavior!

<u>Homework</u>

Homework will be given Monday through Thursday. Students will most often be responsible for one Language Arts and one Math activity plus a set amount of reading each evening. Students will not be required to do written work over the weekend however, reading is ALWAYS encouraged. Homework is expected to be turned in on time. If it is not turned in, it will be marked late and expected to be turned in on the next school day. If the homework is still not completed, the student will complete the homework during lunch recess. Late homework assignments may impact the student's progress report grades.

Book Orders

Book orders will be sent home monthly. If you would like to order books from the book clubs, please pay by check made out to Scholastic Book Clubs. There is also an option to order online; our class code is H8K8P. If you would like to order any books as gifts, please let me know when you place your order so that I can set your order aside.

Home School Literacy Link Strategies for Reading TO---WITH---and-BY your child

- 1. Turn off the TV and radio.
- 2. Find a quiet and comfortable spot.
- 3. Take turns picking out a favorite book. Pick a just right book. The librarians will help you pick an age or reading level appropriate book at the library or I am always available to help with this!
- 4. Read the title and author of the book.
- 5. Take a picture walk; talk about the pictures; make predictions and set a purpose for reading.
- 6. Take turns pointing to the words as you read. This is called tracking.
- 7. Stop while you are reading to ask questions about the story. When the story is finished ask the who, what, when, where, how, and why questions. This builds reading comprehension.
- 8. Reread, reread the story...this builds confidence and fluency.
- 9. When your child feels confident have them read the story to you. Let them ask you questions.
- 10. Finish by having your child draw a picture about the story. Label the picture or write a sentence about the picture.

Remember: The most important results of practicing reading strategies are to have fun and build lifelong readers!!





Dear Family,

Last year in kindergarten, your child began the journey to becoming a reader. This school year, your child will continue down the road to become a better reader, speller, and writer with the help of the Superkids Reading Program.

To make sure everyone gets off to a great start, the first-grade program begins with a review of the 26 letters of the alphabet, one sound for each letter, and how to blend the letter sounds to read simple words and stories. Then children will learn more challenging first-grade sound-spelling patterns and apply their new skills as they read every day. In the Adventures of the Superkids Reader, children will read engaging stories about their friends, the Superkids. In the Super-Duper mini-magazines, children will explore fascinating real-world science and social studies topics. They will also write about their own thoughts and ideas in stories, informational reports, book reviews, poems, and more!

At the end-of each week, we'll-have a spelling-test. Your child will bring home Backpack Pages to practice the spelling words. Spelling lists include Pattern Words that follow sound-spelling patterns children are learning. You can help your child sound these words out to spell them. Some lists also include Memory Words, high-frequency, mostly irregular words. Help your child learn to spell these words from memory.

One Backpack Page each week will help your child develop another important skill, fluency. Fluency is the ability to read smoothly and accurately at a speed that's not too slow or fast. Have your child practice reading aloud the story on the Backpack Page multiple times during the week. With each reading, your child should be able to read more fluently.

The online parent portal will update you on what your child is learning in Superkids each week. You will be astonished by how much your child will grow as a reader and writer over this school year!
