Dear Parent/Guardian,

Enclosed you will find an information packet to assist you in the education and training of your child/children in your home, a concept widely referred to as home schooling.

As a parent of a home schooled child, and in most instances the supervisor of his or her educational program, there are certain responsibilities that must be taken by you under the conditions set forth in section 1327 and 1327. I of the Public School Code of 1949 and amended by Act 169 in 1988. Specific guidelines outlining these responsibilities are included in this packet (Policy 533 - IV Guidelines). Also included is an Affidavit of the Supervisor of a Home School Program appropriate to each child's age and grade level.

Finally, a listing of home schooling submission dates is included, and for your convenience, a copy of the 2016-2017 Neshaminy School District calendar.

I. PURPOSE

Home education is seen as an alternative approach to education consistent with the needs of the community and the interests of individual parents.

II. AUTHORITY

The Board will authorize home education of resident pupils under the conditions set forth in Section 1327 of the Public School Code of 1949 as amended in the Senate Bill 154 of November 22, 1988.

III. GUIDELINES:

- 1. Home education programs will be supervised by the student's parent or guardian or such person having legal custody of the child.
- 2. The home education supervisor will file a notarized affidavit with the Superintendent of schools or his/her designee prior to the commencement of the home education program and annually thereafter on **August 1**ST of each school year, which includes:
 - a) The name of the supervisor and a statement indicating that such person possesses a high school diploma or equivalent.
 - b) The name and age of each child in the program.
 - c) The address and telephone number of the program site.
 - d) An outline of the proposed objectives for each of the required subjects.
 - e) A statement indicating that the required subjects will be taught in the English language.
 - f) Evidence of the child's proper immunizations and a statement that the child will receive health services required for public school students.
 - g) A statement noting that all adults in the home and persons having legal custody have not been convicted, within five years of the affidavit, of criminal offenses which disqualify persons for employment in public and nonpublic schools.

IV. <u>GUIDELINES</u> (continued)

- **3.** At the elementary level, the following courses shall be taught:
 - a) English
 - b) Spelling
 - c) Reading
 - d) Writing
 - e) Mathematics
 - f) Science
 - g) Geography
 - h) History of the United States and Pennsylvania
 - i) Civics
 - j) Safety education, including regular and continuous instruction in danger and prevention of fires
 - k) Health and physiology
 - 1) Physical Education
 - m) Music
 - n) Art
- **4.** At the secondary level, the following courses shall be taught:
 - a) English, to include language, literature, speech, and composition
 - b) Science
 - c) Geography
 - d) Social Studies, to include civics, world history, history of the United States, and Pennsylvania
 - e) Mathematics, to include general mathematics, algebra and geometry
 - f) Art
 - g) Music
 - h) Physical Education
 - i) Health and safety education, including regular and continuous instruction in the dangers and prevention of fires
- **5.** Instruction must include a minimum of 180 days of instruction or 900 or 990 hours of instruction at the elementary and secondary levels, respectively.
- **6.** A pupil in an approved home learning program may participate in PIAA and certain co-curricular school activities or listed in the attached excerpts and supplement.
- 7. Shall not earn a Neshaminy diploma.

IV. <u>GUIDELINES</u> (continued)

- **8.** The supervisor must submit required documentation to their evaluator at the end of the school year which includes: (this update to policy 533 will be made at the next policy board meeting)
 - a) A portfolio of records and materials
 - b) A log listing titles of reading materials
 - c) Samples of writing, worksheets and workbooks
 - d) If your child is in grade 3, 5, or 8, your child's portfolio must include the results of a standardized test from a Pennsylvania Department of Education approved listing of nationally normed tests listed below.
 - 1) California Achievement Test
 - 2) Comprehensive Testing Program (CTPIII)
 - 3) Comprehensive Test of Basic Skills
 - 4) Iowa Test of Basic Skills
 - 5) Metropolitan Achievement Test
 - 6) Stanford Achievement Test
 - 7) TerraNova
 - 8) Peabody Individual Achievement Test
 - 9) Wide Rang Achievement Test
 - 10) Woodcock Johnson Rev Tests of Arh
 - e) PSSA testing for grades 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 11, is not required for home school students. If you would like to have your child take PSSA testing you can make arrangements for your child to take the test at the school that your child would attend if he/she was not home schooled.
- **9.** The supervisor must arrange for an annual written evaluation of the student's educational progress which shall be based on an interview with the child and a review of the portfolio. The evaluation shall certify whether or not an appropriate education is occurring and shall be submitted to the Superintendent of Schools or his/her designee by **June 30**th of each school year. The supervisor has the following options in selecting the evaluator but in no event shall the evaluator be the supervisor of his/her spouse:
 - a) A licensed clinical or school psychologist
 - b) A Pennsylvania certified teacher at the appropriate level or a non-public teacher or administrator with two years of teaching within the last ten years of the appropriate level. The teacher or administrator must have grading and classroom evaluation experience in a listing of academic subjects; not specialties such as art, music, physical education, health and so forth.
 - c) Another person with the agreement of Superintendent of Schools or his/her designee.

IV. <u>GUIDELINES</u> (continued)

- 10. Special education children may participate in a home education program if the program meets the child's needs and is approved by a certificated special education teacher or a licensed clinical or certified school psychologist. Written notification of this approval must be submitted with the notarized affidavit. The supervisor of the home education program can request the school district or intermediate unit to provide required services for the specific needs of a special education child. Upon agreement to provide the services, they shall be provided in the public schools or in a licensed private school.
- 11. If the Superintendent of Schools or his/her designee has a reasonable belief that at any time during the school year appropriate education is not occurring, he or she may request that the portfolio be submitted within 15 days (except for achievement test results) and that the evaluation be submitted within 30 days.
- 12. Should a home schooler enroll in the Neshaminy School District at the secondary level, the School District shall utilize locally developed criteria in order to determine the appropriate number of credits accepted. Should a conflict arise, the Superintendent of Schools or his/her designee shall make a final determination of credits acceptable to the Neshaminy School district.
- 13. Supervisor of home education program site, if relocating, must apply by registered mail 30 days prior to relocation, to the Superintendent of the district in which he/she currently resides requesting a letter of transfer for the home education program. (Must be issued 30 days after the receipt of registered mail request).

Excerpts from Board Policy #533 Participation in PIAA Sports and Co-curricular Activities

A pupil in an approved home education program may participate in certain District sponsored after school co-curricular activities. Co-curricular activities are defined as those listed in the collective bargaining agreement and in notices available in each school. A pupil residing in the Neshaminy School District and enrolled in a private, charter or cyber school is not eligible to participate in any Neshaminy School District sponsored after school co-curricular activities.

The after school co-curricular activities, as determined by the District must already be offered at the same level and at the same school of the home educated student. These after school co-curricular activities as judged by the building level administration and approved by the Superintendent or his/her designee will not include those activities affiliated with the curriculum offerings of the respective school.

- An updated listing of all after school co-curricular activities available to homeeducated students will be available in each school.
- After school co-curricular activities may include those that are sanctioned by the Pennsylvania Interscholastic Athletic Association (PIAA). In addition to the other eligibility criteria listed herein, participation in PIAA scheduled activities will be based upon the PIAA, school and coaching eligibility guidelines and expectations set forth for all other regular enrollment students.

In order to participate in the District sponsored after school co-curricular activities program; home-educated students must abide by the following:

- The home schooled student must provide his/her own transportation to and from after school co-curricular activities not already provided to regular students. Transportation to after school co-curricular activities outside the District will be provided in like for all participants of that after school co-curricular activity. When such transportation is provided from a common location, the home schooled student must provide his/her own transportation from home to and from that common location.
- Application for participation in after school co-curricular activities can be made at the
 time of initial registration of the student for home education instruction (August 1).
 Students already enrolled in the home education must enroll by *March 15 in the year
 preceding inclusion in such after school co-curricular activities for the next school year.

Application will require evidence of current home education status in the Neshaminy School District as well as evidence of all other required documentation necessary to participate in that activity.

- When home educated students are required to enter the building prior to the end of the school day in order to participate in an after school co-curricular activity, they are to report directly to the main office and be registered as "student visitors" for that period of time. This procedure must be followed without exception every day they participate.
- The administration reserves the right to terminate the participant of home educated student participation of home educated student participation in District sponsored after school co-curricular activities when conditions, in the discretion of the administration, so warrant. Parents will be notified by the administration.

JUNE 30, 2017

All evaluations for the 2015-2016 school year indicating that an appropriate education program has been observed must be submitted to the Curriculum, Instruction & Assessment Department.

PLEASE NOTE:

No Home School Program will be approved after the start of the 3^{rd} marking period of any school year. The cutoff for the 2016-2017 year is February 2^{nd} . Any requests made after the February 2^{nd} deadline are subject to review by the Curriculum, Instruction & Assessment Department.

- *Pennsylvania Department of Education now requires that *Home School students* must be tested with a nationally normed standardized test for grades 3, 5, 8. The results for all tests are to be submitted with your child's evaluation. Tests shall not be administered by the child's parent or guardian.
- *Physical Examinations are requested for students entering school and at grades 6 and 11.
- *Dental Examinations are requested for students entering school and at grades 3 and 7.
