Call to Order

Mr. Congdon called the meeting to order at 7:10 p.m.

Pledge of Allegiance

Mr. Congdon requested those in attendance join in the salute to the flag.

Amount Financed: \$32,740,000

This letter acknowledges receipt of the PlanCon Part K, "Project Refinancing," for the above referenced bond issue. The material is in a form acceptable to the department and is hereby approved. This approval is based on a limited review of the documents submitted. If information reviewed subsequent to this approval violates law, policy or procedure, the department reserves the right to rescind any and all approvals materially affected.

Mr. Congdon announced the recent passing of staff members Susan Lentz, cafeteria aide at Carl Sandburg on October 17th, John Toscano, retired English teacher, on October 14th, and Jacki Obringer, retired secretary at Lower Southampton Elementary School, on October 22nd.

Two students from Maple Point, Alexandra Brizzi and Ryan Jagaczewski invited the community to the Veterans Day Ceremony on Friday, November 6th, at Maple Point Middle School.

Public Comment

Bob Tull, resident of Levittown, suggested that when policy change notices are included in the handout packets the old policy should be mentioned in addition to the new policy.

Tina Hollenbach, resident of Trevose, thanked the Board for their years of service in the face of many tumultuous meetings and controversy. She said the Board operates with the best interest of the children as the main focus and this should be applauded.

Karen Lowry, resident of Lower Southampton, thanked Dr. Hancock for responding to her inquiries in a timely manner. Ms. Lowry expressed concern about the privacy and security of the students in regard to the camera/audio feature on the iPads. She asked who will be monitoring this and what are the security and privacy measures that will be put into place.

Steve Rodos, retired, resident of Villages of Flowers Mill, commented that he was impressed by the enthusiasm of the fifth graders when he recently substituted at Maple Point Middle School. Mr. Rodos said he would like to see the Board advertise for more grant writing to gain funds for educational programs. He also said he would like to see the income requirements for senior citizens increased to allow them more tax assistance. Mr. Rodos asked for an explanation of the settlement agreement with the advocacy alliance on the payment register.

WHEREAS, public schools are community catalysts, bringing together adults and children, educators and volunteers, business leaders and elected officials in a common enterprise;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Neshaminy Board of School Directors hereby proclaims November 16 – 20, 2015, as the 94th annual observance of American Education Week.

Mr. Pirritano seconded the motion.

The Board unanimously approved said report by a vote of 8 ayes and 0 nays. (Mrs. Cummings was not present.)

The Board unanimously approved said report by a vote of 9 ayes and 0 nays.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Neshaminy Board of School Directors approves the following overnight trip:

Mr. Rudy seconded the motion.

The Board unanimously approved said report by a vote of 9 ayes and 0 nays.

Other Board Business

None.

Public Comment

Debbie Harker, banker, resident of Middletown Township, directed a hypothetical scenario to Mr. Morris as an experimental example to explain the benefits of the consolidation plan.

Karen Lowry, resident of Lower Southampton made the suggestion that Dr. Bowman's name be considered when it is time to name the new elementary school on the Tawanka site.

Steve Rodos, resident of Villages of Flowers Mill, commented that since Neshaminy is gaining a new school in addition to upgrading 4-5 schools without the payment increasing for the next 10 plus years, why would anyone favor postponing the action for another 10 years when rates most likely would be higher. He said a delay would only result in depriving the students of attending more efficient schools as well as new educational opportunities.

Future Topics

None.

Board Comment

Ms. Boyle explained that the changes to policies are presented at the Policy Committee meetings and copies of the original wording and the revisions are distributed at the Work Session meetings. Ms. Boyle stated that she will look into getting the information on the website. She also said that she has received numerous complaints about the political rhetoric that has been posted on the Neshaminy Facebook site and Ms. Boyle asked that everyone refrain from using the site for political purposes.

Mr. Morris responded to Ms. Harker's scenario by explaining that he is in favor of updating existing school buildings, but he is not in favor of closing schools and spending money on building new schools. Mr. Morris said the decision created an imbalance in the district by allowing only a small percentage of the district benefit by the new school.

Mr. Shubin voiced his disagreement with another Board member's point of view that was expressed in a letter to the editor. He stated that the Board member's information was misleading regarding financing and the full-day kindergarten funding. Mr. Shubin said that the Board made the right decision to upgrade buildings while keeping the taxpayers in mind and keeping the payment the same.

Mr. Rudy rebutted Mr. Shubin's statements by saying he did not mislead anyone with his facts. He stated that he was in favor of renovating all the schools instead of building a new school and closing Samuel Everitt School. He said, in his opinion, the cost of the project that the district has undertaken is far beyond what he considers reasonable.

Public Board Meeting Minutes of the Neshaminy Board of School Directors (cont.) October 27, 2015

Mr. Sposato commented that the money will go toward improving older schools, which was badly needed. He said the district should be planning to replace all the schools in the future. Mr. Sposato said he totally respects the Board members who voted for the consolidation plan because they made the responsible decision for the district, while keeping politics out of it.

Mr. Morris stated that the funding for full-day kindergarten came from funds found by the Board and not from Mr. Copeland. He said the additional funds were made possible from negotiations between the Board and the NFT under the leadership of Mr. Webb.

Mr. Allen reminded the public of the Veteran's Day ceremony on November 6th at Maple Point Middle School at 11:00 am. He stated that the decisions that were made by the Board were certainly not easy decisions, but they did the right thing.

Mrs. Cummings read highlights from an article about the responsibilities of a school board member. She stated that the majority of the Board members follow those rules and put the needs of the students above all else and said she is proud to have served on the Neshaminy School Board. She said Neshaminy has made many great changes and implemented new educational programs and she is sure that Neshaminy will continue to move forward in the right direct.

Mr. Pirritano discussed the ages and conditions of school buildings in the district and declared that doing nothing about the situation was not a responsible option. He said that due to PSERS the only way to save money is through operations. Mr. Pirritano said to maintain a viable school district that people can afford to live in some tough decisions are necessary. He urged everyone to utilize their right to vote in the November 4th election.

Mr. Congdon mentioned that he received a complaint from a fifth grade student who was upset that the fifth graders are somewhat segregated from the upper classmen and this makes her feel like they are being treated like babies. Mr. Congdon said he will get more information about the funding that created the opportunity to implement full-day kindergarten. Mr. Congdon concluded by stating the consolidation plan was needed and was the right decision and this is just the beginning. He said considering the age of the school buildings there will be a need for more new schools in the very near future and the planning should begin soon.

Adjournment

Mr. Congdon moved the meeting be adjourned and Ms. Boyle seconded the motion. The Board unanimously approved the motion. Mr. Congdon adjourned the meeting at 9:38 p.m.

This letter acknowledges receipt of the PlanCon Part K, "Project Refinancing," for the above-referenced bond issue. The material is in a form acceptable to the department and is hereby approved. This approval is based on a limited review of the documents submitted. If information reviewed subsequent to this approval violates law, policy or procedure, the department reserves the right to rescind any and all approvals materially affected.

Any funds returned to the school district after all refunded bonds have been retired must be used to reduce the reimbursable amortization on the refunding bond issue. The school district is directed to report the unexpended funds related to the escrow to the Comptroller's Office after April 30, 2016. The Commonwealth will share in any funds returned to the school district by reducing the next scheduled debt service payment on the refunding bond issue. Unadjusted overpayments will be cited in future Auditor General audit findings.

A condition of this approval is that, unless otherwise approved by the department, all available funds in the bond issues being refunded are to be used to reduce the principal amount of the new bond issue. Any funds remaining at closing which are not earmarked for capital projects and any excess proceeds from the refunding bond issue must be transferred to the debt service fund established for the new bond issue. These funds are not subject to reimbursement by the Commonwealth.

The school district must file form PDE-2071, "Application For Reimbursement For School Construction Project," to the Comptroller's Office to receive the reimbursement on this financing. The lease number and reimbursable percent referenced above must be included on form PDE-2071.
