Call to Order

Mr. Congdon called the meeting to order at 7:11 p.m.

Pledge of Allegiance

Mr. Congdon requested those in attendance join in the salute to the flag.

Announcements

Superintendent's Report

Dr. Baugh informed the Board on the following:

- Recognized Barbara Markowitz for receiving the Certificate of Achievement for Excellence in Financial Reporting Award.
- District Leadership Team met for three days to work on school initiative for the upcoming school year.
- Orientations for all elementary, middle, and the high school were this week.
- Update on the construction project.
- Damion Spar from Reynolds Construction gave a short update on the construction project.
- The latest construction update will be posted on the website.
- Safety at all Neshaminy Schools remains to be one of the safest places in the country.
- Budget cuts regarding the Playwickian.

Public Comment

Pete Spera, retired, resident of Langhorne, asked why the financial savings that the district is realizing from the consolidation plan are being used for positions such as a public spokesperson, and a coordinator of student affairs, when the funds should be used for educational programs. Mr. Spera also mentioned that compared to Council Rock and Central Bucks School Districts, Neshaminy tests scores are lower showing there is a need for better educational programs.

Robert Sanna, resident of Levittown, commented that the Board has yet to form a policy for RFP's, which was discussed several months ago during a public meeting. Mr. Sanna requested that the Policy Committee resolve this matter without delay, so the Board can proceed to put out future RFP's for particular bids.

Stacy O'Brien asked for an update on the iPad program. She asked for clarification on the new payment plan for the lunch program.

Karen Lowry, resident of Lower Southampton, compared what it costs neighboring school districts to educate each student with Neshaminy's costs, which are higher. She said that Neshaminy's test scores rank us lower than we should be even though the student to teacher ratio is less than in districts who rank above us. Ms. Lowry suggested that the Board is using the funds incorrectly on high paid positions rather than educational programs.

The Board unanimously approved said report by a vote of 9 ayes and 0 nays.

5) State Mandated Food Price Increase

WHEREAS, proper nutrition for school students contributes to health and academic performance; and

WHEREAS, school food lunch programs must meet federal dietary guidelines established by the United States Departments of Agriculture and Health and Human Services; and

WHEREAS, continuing to provide low-cost, nutritionally beneficial school meals to elementary and secondary students is both a health and education objective; and

WHEREAS, schools provide student meals in concert with the federal and state government; and

WHEREAS, the USDA's New Healthy Hunger Free Kids Act of 2010 mandated increases in the price structure for paid meals.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the following student lunch prices will go into effect September 2015:

Elementary "Type A" lunch price will increase to \$2.50

Secondary "Type A" lunch price will increase to \$3.00

Elementary Breakfast price will increase to \$1.25

Secondary Breakfast price will increase to \$1.50

6) Alternative Programming

- Mr. Morris asked for clarification on the State Mandated Food Price Increases.
- Mrs. Markowitz stated the updates to the State Mandated Food Price Increases.

The Board unanimously approved said item 1, 2, 5, and 6 by a vote of 9 ayes and 0 nays.

3) Ratification of Agreement Between the Neshaminy Board of School Directors and the Neshaminy School District Administrators Association

Mr. Pirritano read the following motion:

WHEREAS, the Neshaminy Board of School Directors and the Neshaminy School District Administrators Association have participated in meet and discuss sessions; and

WHEREAS, the negotiating teams for the Neshaminy Board of School Directors and the Neshaminy School District Administrators Association have accepted a proposed agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Neshaminy Board of School Directors ratify the said proposed agreement between the Neshaminy School District Administrators Association and the Neshaminy School District commencing July 1, 2015 and ending June 30, 2020.

- Ms. Boyle seconded the motion.
- Mr. Morris asked who the Director of Management Informational Services is.
- Dr. Baugh stated that Mrs. Christie is the Director.
- Mr. Morris asked for clarification regarding 10 and a half month employee benefits.
- Mr. Pirritano clarified the 10 and a half month employee benefits package.

Mr. Congdon called for a roll call tally and the tally indicated that the motion passed by a vote of 7 ayes, (Mr. Allen, Ms. Boyle, Mr. Congdon, Mrs. Cummings, Mr. Pirritano, Mr. Shubin and Mr. Sposato) and 2 nays, (Mr. Morris and Mr. Rudy).

4) Ratification of Agreement Between the Neshaminy Board of School Directors and the Confidential Secretaries

Mr. Shubin read the following motion:

WHEREAS, the negotiating teams for the Neshaminy Board of School Directors and the Confidential Secretaries have accepted a proposed agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Neshaminy Board of School Directors ratify the said proposed agreement between the Confidential Secretaries and the Neshaminy School District commencing July 1, 2015 and ending June 30, 2019.

Mr. Pirritano seconded the motion.

The Board unanimously approved said motion by a vote of 9 ayes and 0 nays.

7) Human Resource Agreement Between the School District and Theresa Hinterberger

Mr. Congdon read the following motion:

WHEREAS, the Neshaminy Board of School Directors and Theresa Hinterberger have accepted a proposed agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Neshaminy Board of School Directors approve the said agreement between Theresa Hinterberger, Director of Human Resources, and the Neshaminy School District commencing July 1, 2015 and ending June 30, 2020.

Ms. Boyle seconded the motion.

Mr. Morris objected to the motion due to the fact that he did not see the contract.

Mr. Profy reviewed the details of the contract.

The motion passed by a vote of 8 ayes, and 1 nay, (Mr. Morris).

Other Board Business

Solicitor's Report

Mr. Profy advised the Board on the litigation matter commenced by Wood Services, Inc., in February, 2014, and recommended the approval of the memorandum of understanding, which will conclude the litigation and enhance the position of compensation which the school district receives in relationship with Wood Services Inc., and the school district as it pertains to a nonresident students, which is commonly referred to as wards of the state.

Mr. Congdon made a motion to accept said motion.

Mr. Shubin seconded the motion.

The Board unanimously approved said motion by a vote of 9 ayes and 0 nays.

Public Comment

Pete Spera, retired, resident of Langhorne, said he does not see the need for a 10.5 month employee getting paid vacation. He also voiced his approval of employees being paid according to their performance evaluation. Mr. Spera said it is unfair that the food service workers helped to make money for the district and still had their pay cut. He stated that his experience has proven that outsourcing does not work.

Mindy Anderson, secretary at Oliver Heckman, resident of Levittown, said the support staff was the first of the Neshaminy employees to take a pay cut and they have sacrificed more than any other department and still the buildings are run efficiently and these employees perform above and beyond. Ms. Anderson stated that the district continues to ask more and more of the support staff and yet they are not given the proper acknowledgement.

Karen Lowry, resident of Lower Southampton, voiced her concerns about the iPads, particularly what security is in place for student data, protocol for security breach, and student's privacy. Ms. Lowry also asked for an update on the charge fee for the iPad program.

Katie Clark, resident of Langhorne, asked what is the procedure for deciding the borders within the school district that determines what areas will attend the new elementary school that is being built.

Robert Sanna, resident of Levittown, asked for an update from Mr. Profy regarding a law from 1949 concerning the right to a free education. Mr. Sanna also asked why fifth graders from the gate sections are walking to Carl Sandburg Middle School since it involves crossing Trenton Road, etc.

Future Topics

None.

Board Comment

Mr. Shubin stated that no food services managers have been dismissed. He invited the public to read the review of the food service program on the Neshaminy website to get the correct facts. Mr. Shubin congratulated Barbara Markowitz for her award and stated that it is well deserved. He requested everyone to urge the politicians in Harrisburg to finalize the budget. Mr. Shubin acknowledged the hard work that the support staff does to prepare the schools for the school year and he said they really do a wonderful job. He stated that the proper security and privacy measures are in place for the iPad program and he remarked what an incredible platform it is for the students. He questioned why anyone would look for negative aspects and try to derail this wonderful opportunity for the students.

Ms. Boyle said there is a Policy Committee meeting scheduled for September 1, 2015 and welcomed the public to attend. She also congratulated Mrs. Markowitz for her award and thanked Damion Spar for his dedication to the consolidation project. Ms. Boyle assured the public that the administrators deserve their compensation because they are experts in their fields who perform a difficult job while making it look seamless.

Mr. Sposato commented that a lot of progress has been made in the Neshaminy School District over the past two years. He said there has been tremendous improvement educationally, e.g., STEM program, English Arts program, increased grades as well as safety upgrades in buses and buildings. Mr. Sposato said that this Board has strived to bring about improvements and move Neshaminy forward; however, people should realize that it is a long term process and everything cannot happen overnight.

Mr. Morris reiterated his position regarding the bidding process for the health insurance broker. He stated that as a result of the lack of an RFP process, it is now costing the district \$29 thousand more than it should have. He also congratulated Mrs. Markowitz for her award.

Mr. Shubin commented that the district does need a public relations spokesperson and it is standard for most of the surrounding school districts. He said it is a multi-task job in a competitive environment. Additionally, Mr. Shubin pointed out that the public should remember that charter schools outsource all positions.

Mrs. Markowitz stated that the transaction fee for the pay program for food services and iPad program is 5%. She said that this new scheme should save the district money. She informed parents that they must have the student's ID number to register, which can be found in the student's Google email.

Mr. Pirritano congratulated Mrs. Markowitz for her award and for her dedicated work for the district and community. He said the support staff did a fantastic job getting the schools ready for the 2015-2016 school year. Mr. Pirritano stated that the GESA program is on schedule and on budget. He commented that the new state rating system for administrators prevents the Board from using a performance based raise practice.

Public Board Meeting Minutes of the Neshaminy Board of School Directors (cont.) August 25, 2015

Mr. Minotti gave an overview of the walking/busing procedures for students attending Carl Sandburg Middle School. He assured the parents that the proper safety measures are in place for students who walk and must cross Trenton Road with 2 crossing guards on duty and a traffic light in place.

Mr. Profy stated that after thorough research, it has been determined that the Neshaminy School District has the right to implement the iPad program and charge an annual service fee of \$30 per student provided that there is no alteration of the curriculum by eliminating text books to substitute the iPad for text books, and the students are not required to conduct homework assignments on the iPad. Furthermore, the district has the right to waive the fee based upon the financial income and circumstances of the student.

Mr. Allen thanked Reynolds for bringing project in on time. He also thanked the support staff for their hard work to get the buildings ready on time. Mr. Allen voiced his opposition to outsourcing. He expressed his satisfaction with the progress that has been made in the Special Ed department in Neshaminy. Mr. Allen concluded by congratulating and thanking Mrs. Markowitz for her award and dedicated service.

Dr. Baugh remarked that he is very impressed with the level of work and dedication that Neshaminy has displayed during this transitional period. Dr. Baugh said the district should be very proud of the commitment and dedication that has been displayed in moving Neshaminy forward. He reminded residents that their property values are tied directly to the public school system, not charter schools, private schools, or cyber schools. Dr. Baugh stated that he has found Neshaminy to be an impressive district striving to be better and he congratulated the Board for their efforts.

Mr. Congdon confirmed that the iPad program will contain proper security controls, and students' privacy will be protected. He mentioned his dissatisfaction with some members of the public expressing negativity and he requested those residents to take a more positive attitude toward making Neshaminy the best district it can be. Mr. Congdon said the salaries of the administrators are midline in the county and the work that the administrators have done deserves the compensation they are receiving. He stated that Neshaminy employees are valued and they are well taken care of comparatively to Bucks County standards.

Mr. Devlin clarified that several years ago he compared the number of students in the district to the number of teachers resulting in the ratio of 13 - 1 student to teacher ratio, not class size ratio.

Adjournment

Mr. Congdon moved the meeting be adjourned and Mr. Allen seconded the motion. The Board unanimously approved the motion. Mr. Congdon adjourned the meeting at 9:11 p.m.
