5) Approval of Acting Superintendent for Gloria R. Hancock, Ed.D.

Mr. Torrente read the following motion:

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Neshaminy School Board of Directors approve an Acting Superintendent employment contract for Gloria R. Hancock, Ed.D., for a one year term maximum with a start date

of September 29, 2015, subject to automatic termination upon election of District Superintendent and also upon 60 day's notice from with the School District, or Acting Superintendent to the other.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the contract, which has been prepared and reviewed by the Solicitor of the School District and presented to the Board of Directors at this meeting, be approved and the Board authorizes the Board President and Secretary of the Board to execute and contract on behalf of the School District.

Mr. Congdon made a motion to accept the Approval of Acting Superintendent for Dr. Gloria Hancock.

Ms. Boyle seconded the motion.

The Board unanimously approved said motion by a vote of 9 ayes and 0 nays.

Other Board Business

Public Comment

Karen Lowry, resident of Lower Southampton, stated that she has emailed Kathy Christie two times with questions about the iPad program and it took 3 weeks for her questions to be acknowledged.

Robert Sanna, resident of Levittown, said that at the last meeting it was insinuated by a Board member that the neighborhood residents around the former Samuel Everitt Elementary School were upset that the IU children are now occupying that school. Mr. Sanna said it is untrue and the Board member should apologize for the insinuation.

Suzi Drake, NFT Vice President, announced that the Neshaminy High School Howler Literary Magazine won the Columbia Press Association Gold Crown Award. Ms. Drake thanked everyone who supported the Bertucci's fund raiser saying that the Neshaminy Education Foundation raised over \$700. She stated that TD Bank will donate \$10 per account and \$25 for new accounts when patrons mention Neshaminy Education Foundation.

Future Topics

None.

Board Comment

Mr. Shubin congratulated Dr. Hancock for her position as Acting Superintendent. Mr. Shubin commented that he feels too much is sometimes focused on testing and there are other ways of measuring success. He asked Dr. Hancock to address a public comment about PSSA testing.

Dr. Hancock stated that the test contents and cut scores have been changed midway, which has affected not only Neshaminy School District, but most districts statewide. Dr. Hancock further stated that, although the test scores have been lower, Neshaminy has consistently been above the state standard.

Mrs. Cummings welcomed Dr. Hancock in the role of Acting Superintendent. In response to Mr. Sanna's remark about the residents of the gate sections around Everitt, Mrs. Cummings said she was not implying anything about the feelings of the residents, but rather she was making a rebuttal to a comment from another member.

Ms. Boyle said testing has been discussed many times at the Educational Development Committee meetings and will be again in the future.

Mr. Allen thanked Dr. Hancock for accepting the position of Acting Superintendent. Mr. Allen stated that he is confident that the majority of residents in the area around the new IU school location have no problem with the

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new occupants of the building; however, when he was canvassing that area, he did encounter some questions and concerns from a few people. He stated that mindset is something that the community has to work on.

Mr. Morris said the IU does an excellent job and he does not think the residents have a problem with their occupancy. He said he thinks the problem stems from the residents losing their neighborhood school and their feelings that their wishes were ignored by some members of the Board.

Mr. Sposato and Mr. Rudy thanked Dr. Hancock for accepting the position and taking on a bigger work load.

Ms. Boyle also congratulated and thanked Dr. Hancock.

Mr. Pirritano expressed appreciation to Dr. Hancock for accepting the position. Mr. Pirritano thanked the staff at Poquessing and Neshaminy High School for a successful "Back to School Night." He asked Dr. Hancock to address the comments about the busing problems.

Dr. Hancock explained that there is a difference between bus incidents and reportable accidents. The records reflect that for this school year there have been 5 reportable bus accidents. The figure of 15 accidents encompasses the 2014-2015 school year.

Mr. Meehan stated the bus tardiness problem at Oliver Heckman is being addressed.

Kathy Christie apologized for any misunderstanding, but confirmed that she had, indeed, replied to Ms. Lowry's inquiries and she offered to forward copies of her replies if necessary.

Mr. Congdon reiterated that the bus issue is being addressed. He said that the PSSA results have fallen in other school districts across the state and not just in Neshaminy. Mr. Congdon said the "Back to School Nights" were very well attended and a great success. Mr. Congdon concluded by thanking Dr. Hancock for stepping up and accepting a very challenging position.

Adjournment

Mr. Congdon moved the meeting be adjourned and Mr. Pirritano seconded the motion. The Board unanimously approved the motion. Mr. Congdon adjourned the meeting at 8:05 p.m.
