5. Public Comment

Kevin Gallagher, IT analyst, Middletown Township, thanked the Board for their service. Mr. Gallagher suggested that the Board consider adopting an RFP procedure in the future when spending over a certain dollar amount. Mr. Gallagher said the consolidation plan is certainly an emotional issue, but when setting emotion aside, it is the right decision.

6. Items for Approval Tonight

b) Lease Agreement with Bucks County Intermediate Unit #22 for Everitt

It is **RESOLVED** that the School District enter into a Lease for the lease by the School District of that certain building appurtenant tract of ground commonly known as the Samuel Everitt Elementary School located at Forsythia Drive South, Middletown Township, Bucks County, PA to Bucks County Intermediate Unit, #22 for a Term of five (5) years commencing on July 1, 2015 for a base annual rent of \$309,000 for the first year of the Term with a rent escalator of three (3%) percent for each subsequent year of the term subject to the terms and conditions of the Lease as approved by the Solicitor of the School District;

IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED, that the President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer and Solicitor of the School District are hereby authorized and directed on behalf of the School District, and under its Corporate Seal, to execute the Lease as approved by the Solicitor and such other documents and other Affidavits, to take such further action as may be required by law and necessary or desirable to effectuate the Lease in the intent of this Resolution.

PUBLIC WORK SESSION

1. Call to Order

Ms. Boyle called the meeting to order at 7:31 p.m.

2. Items for Approval at the April 21st Public Board Meeting

a) Bids/Budget Transfers

Mrs. Markowitz stated there are two bids, Bid #16-18 and Bid #16-19. There is one Budget Transfer Report (Working Copy) 15-5 in the amount of \$608.00.

3. Committee Reports

a) Board Polices

Ms. Boyle stated to the Board that the next meeting is scheduled for April 14th, at 6:30 p.m.

b) Educational Development

Ms. Boyle stated to the Board that the next meeting is scheduled for May 12th, at 6:30 p.m.

c) Finance/Facilities

Mr. Congdon was not present.

d) IU Board

Mrs. Cummings announced that she was unable to attend the last meeting due to scheduling conflicts.

e) Neshaminy Education Foundation

Mr. Shubin stated that April 18th, will be the Color Fest.

Suzie Drake explained that the Color Fest is being held to raise money to benefit Glut 1 DS to help a student at Hoover who suffers from the disease.

f) Technical School

Mr. Morris stated there was no update at this time.

g) Technology

Mr. Shubin stated to the Board that at the last meeting they reviewed future upgrades. No date has yet been set for the next meeting.

h) Facilities Ad Hoc Committee

Mr. Pirritano announced that the next meeting has been scheduled for April 13th, at 6:30 p.m.

i) Legislative

Mr. Shubin stated that no date has been set for the next meeting.

4. Public Comment

Steve Rodos, retired, Villages of Flowers Mill, asked if the lease with the IU is a net-net (double net) lease. Mr. Rodos advised the public that the website contains valuable information on the STEM program, which demonstrates that the district is being transparent and forthcoming. Mr. Rodos asked how the previous insurance contract compares with what we will be getting with the new insurance contract. He also asked if the insurance company is the same and the cost is now reduced, is it possible for Neshaminy to get a rebate from the previous contract, which was more money.

Mr. Profy answered that the IU lease will be a triple net lease.

Ms. Boyle said the Board will get back to Mr. Rodos on the insurance question.

5. Future Topics

Mr. Pirritano asked Mr. McConnell to come to the podium to explain the Rotary Club's involvement with Neshaminy.

Mr. McConnell said the Rotary Club recognizes a Student of the Month from Neshaminy and also awards between 2-4 college scholarships to Neshaminy students yearly.

Mr. Pirritano also noted that Mrs. Drake's Interact Club from Neshaminy is a group of students who are very involved with the functions provided by the Rotary Club.

6. Board Comment

Mr. Allen asked Mr. Copeland for an explanation on "Transfer of Entity."

Mr. Copeland said the Transfer of Entity occurs when special education classes are transferred from the IU back to the control of Neshaminy district, which results in a financial savings.

Mr. Sposato advised the public that the Educational Development meetings provide valuable information to parents about the direction that Neshaminy is taking towards providing first quality education and he urged them to attend.

Mr. Morris remarked that in the past when an RFP was given, it resulted in attaining the best insurance for the district at the best price. He said unfortunately an RFP was not done this time.

Mr. Pirritano urged the public to look at the Neshaminy Newsletter on the website. He added that at times Neshaminy does use the RFP process, but it was not done this time; however, he feels the Board still made the right decision.

Mr. Rudy agreed with Mr. Morris that an RFP should have been put out before the vote.

Mr. Shubin thanked the students from Carl Sandburg for their presentation. He also commented that students should take the PSSA tests because it is good for the district and it is good practice for the students. Mr. Shubin said the district will be looking at standardized tests in the future to see if any can be eliminated or improved upon.

7. Adjournment of Meeting

Ms. Boyle moved the meeting be adjourned and Mr. Shubin seconded the motion. The Board unanimously approved the motion. Ms. Boyle adjourned the meeting at 8:04 p.m.

The materials for PlanCon Part E, "Design Development," have been reviewed and appear to meet the requirements of the school laws of Pennsylvania and the policies and regulations of the State Board of Education. The Design Development is generally approved. This approval is based on a limited review of the documents submitted. If information reviewed subsequent to this approval violates law, policy or procedure, the department reserves the right to rescind any and all approvals materially affected.

Please note that the Requirements listed on PlanCon Part F, Page F-17, must be written in the Construction Specifications. You are further advised that in all school buildings erected after May 1, 1925, or buildings leased or used for school purposes, all entrance and exit doors, as well as all doors leading to or from all regular, special, or general rooms, shall open outward, in accordance with 24 P.S. § 7-739.

Provisions for acoustical separation between the following rooms are advisable:

- 1) between each Music Classroom
- 2) between the Music Classrooms and the adjacent Art Room

The PlanCon Part F, "Construction Documents," may now be prepared and submitted upon their completion at the final review conference, according to PlanCon Pages F01 and F02. The district's architect should call me at 717.787.5993 to schedule the review conference. Any substantial changes in the design must be discussed with me at your earliest convenience.

Section 731 of the Public School Code of 1949 states that no public school building shall be contracted for, constructed, or reconstructed, in any school district of the second, third, or fourth class until plans and specifications have been approved by the Department of Education. Departmental approval of final plans and specifications only occurs upon the issuance of written approval of PlanCon Part F, "Construction Documents." For the Philadelphia City and Pittsburgh School Districts, PlanCon Part F must be approved by the department prior to entering into contracts for a school construction project to qualify for state reimbursement. Failure to comply with the applicable statutory or departmental requirement will result in denial of reimbursement for this project.



The materials for PlanCon Part D, "Project Accounting Based on Estimates," have been reviewed and approved. This approval is based on a limited review of the documents submitted. If information reviewed subsequent to this approval violates law, policy or procedure, the department reserves the right to rescind any and all approvals materially affected.

Please note the corrections to Page D18, regarding 2012 updates.

Based on the information submitted, this project is in compliance with the requirements of Act 34 of 1973.

Act 34 of 1973 requires a second public hearing if the Maximum Building Construction Cost based on bids equals or exceeds by eight percent the amount approved by the Department of Education based on estimates. For this project, the Act 34 Maximum Building Construction Cost, as reported on Page D20, Line C, is \$27,264,141. The Act 34 Maximum Building Construction Cost based on estimates plus eight percent is \$29,445,272.

If at any time the Maximum Building Construction Cost exceeds the Aggregate Building Expenditure Standard, this project will require a referendum. The Aggregate Building Expenditure Standard, as reported on Page D23, Line E, for this project is \$32,447,359, based on the current Act 34 Per Pupil Cost Limits.

The Local Government Unit Debt Act permits school districts to exclude subsidized debt from non-electoral and lease rental debt for the purpose of establishing net outstanding debt. For subsidized debt to be excluded, a copy of the Commonwealth's preliminary approval for the project and the related bonds or notes for reimbursement must be filed with the Department of Community and Economic Development. A copy of Page D14, Estimated Temporary Reimbursable Percent for Each Bond Issue, for each of the bond issues financing this project is attached solely for this purpose.

The "Prime Contractor Certification" (Page G08) will be required from each prime contractor as part of the PlanCon Part G, "Project Accounting Based on Bids," submission for this project. Specifications should require that such information be provided by the successful bidders. Suggested language to be included in the bid specifications is included in the instructions for PlanCon Part F, "Construction Documents."
