**Call to Order**

Mr. Congdon called the meeting to order at 7:05p.m.

**Superintendent's Report**

Dr. Hancock advised the Board on the following:

- Graduation Date will be June 15<sup>th</sup> - Rain Date June 16<sup>th</sup>.
- Mr. Ed Furman from Maillie, LLP, reviewed the 14-15 Audit and answered questions from the Board.
- Congratulations to Teacher, Tara Ring, who has been named Teacher of the Year by the Southeastern District of the Pennsylvania State Association.
- Congratulations to Teacher, Anne Schmidt, who was named the VFW Post 6393 Teacher of the Year.
- Three Neshaminy High School artists, Ana Kezherashville, Christina Chen and Chase Stanley were honored with art awards.
- Zachary Vasquez, 6<sup>th</sup> grader at Maple Point, was honored at the BCIU for his artistic and creative achievements while in 5<sup>th</sup> grade.
- Steam Expo 2016, will be held April 7<sup>th</sup>.
- NHS cheerleaders took National Title at the AmeriCheer International Championships.
- Poquessing Middle School Interact Club helped out at the Feasterville Rotary Pancake Breakfast.

**Public Comment**

Deb Harker said the closing of Oliver Heckman Elementary School affects more than just the parents and students of that school. She said that the financial benefit will affect the entire school district and it is the right thing to do. Ms. Harker said that over the next 10 years the budget will be extremely stressed due to PSERS and education cannot be sustained without cutbacks.

Leann Hartpence, resident of Langhorne, said that if the Road Map that has been planned for consolidation is not followed how will the district save money and deal with the upcoming PSERS dilemma. She asked Mr. Rudy what other school he would recommend for closing if Heckman is allowed to stay open. Ms. Hartpence also asked Mr. Sanna and Mr. Feather if Heckman is not closed then where will the funds be found to renovate the building.

Steve Rodos, retired, resident of Villages of Flowers Mills, commented that following the Road Map for the consolidation plan by closing 2 more elementary schools is what is best for the entire Neshaminy School District and not just a small minority of residents who have a vested interest in the 2 neighborhood schools. He said it makes no fiscal sense to deny better educational programs to all the students of the district in order to keep an outdated school open and spend funds to fix it up when there is a better plan.

**Other Board Business**

Mr. Congdon read the following statement.

Mr. Scott Congdon, President of the Neshaminy Board of School Directors, of the Neshaminy School District, does, hereby call a special meeting to be held, Tuesday, April 12, 2016, at 7:00 p.m., in the auditorium at the Maple Point Middle School, 2250 Yardley Langhorne Road, Yardley, Pa., 19047, to consider and act upon, whether or not, to permanently close the Lower Southampton Elementary School, located at 7 School Lane, Lower Southampton, Middletown Township, Bucks County, Pa., at the end of the 2015/2016 school year.

As well as, to consider and act upon, whether or not, to permanently close the Oliver Heckman Elementary School, located at Maple Avenue and Cherry Street, Middletown Township, Bucks County, Pa., at the end of the 2015/2016 school year.

And, the taking of such other actions as lawfully come before this special meeting. Notice shall be given pursuant to the provisions of the Pennsylvania Public School Code of 1949, as amended and the Pennsylvania Sunshine Act of 1986, July 3rd, PL388 No. 84 as amended.

The secretary of the Board of School Directors, shall give written notice of the special meeting, to each member of the Board.

Members of the public are invited to attend and participate in this special meeting as permitted by law.

**Public Comment**

Deb Harker, resident of Langhorne, asked if the summer program will again include an after-care program associated with the Neshaminy Kid's Club.

Lisa Bowman, president of Neshaminy High School Boosters, resident of Middletown Township, suggested that John Mason be considered for the permanent position of head coach for the Neshaminy Basketball team. She stated that the players and parents totally support Mr. Mason and he has done an excellent job in coaching the team since he has taken over.

John Mason, interim coach for Neshaminy Basketball team, asked to be considered for the permanent position of head coach stating that he will continue to lead the team to the best of his ability.

Steve Rodos, retired, resident of Villages of Flowers Mill, asked about the current status of the search for a new school superintendent. He also asked if the public will have the opportunity to interview or meet the candidates.

**Board Comment**

Mr. Rudy said he is in favor of keeping Oliver Heckman Elementary School open because it represents the largest geographic area of the district and should have a neighborhood school. He said there were other

options such as keeping all the elementary schools open and only close one middle school. Mr. Rudy said that option still would have saved money for the district.

Dr. Hancock said that they will continue to partner with the Neshaminy Kid's Club to provide after-care for the summer program. She stated that everyone's input is taken under advisement; however, there is a process for selecting the new coach for the basketball team, which must be followed. Dr. Hancock said it is hopeful that a food service program will be in place for the start of the next school year.

Ms. Boyle said the IU is conducting the search for a new superintendent and all candidates have been assured of confidentiality during the process.

Mr. Pirritano stated that, in a perfect world, there would be neighborhood schools in all areas. However, in reality, due to student decline and the future financial hardships, it is not the answer to Neshaminy's needs right now. He said the focus is to offer the best educational programs for the students and there is no other solution.

Mr. Feather said in his opinion, he does not think Oliver Heckman is the right choice to close. He said he feels there are other options that should be looked into by the Board.

Ms. Boyle said the district needs the additional funding obtained by closing 2 more schools. She stated that if Heckman was kept open, it would require significant expenditures to renovate the building for health and safety purposes.

Mr. Congdon stated that the consolidation debate has been ongoing in Neshaminy for multiple years and it has always generated controversy. He said that the decision that has been made is the best solution that has been determined by much study and evaluation. Mr. Congdon reiterated Dr. Hancock's remark that the decision about the new basketball coach must go through the standard process. Mr. Congdon thanked the PTO from Hoover Elementary School and the Neshaminy Kid's Club for donating Adventure Wall Mats for the Hoover gym.

#### Adjournment

Mr. Congdon moved the meeting be adjourned and Mr. Rudy seconded the motion. The Board unanimously approved the motion. Mr. Condon adjourned the meeting at 8:08 p.m.
