Neshaminy School District Food Services Information

Neshaminy Food Service offers a delicious, healthy breakfast and lunch at all schools and at an affordable price. It has been shown that students who eat healthy meals at school are more alert, well behaved, and ready to learn. Even our Ala Cart items meet the Smart Snack guidelines.

School meals at Neshaminy meet the USDA's required regulations as students are encouraged to choose at least 3 of the 5 great choices including Meat/Meat Alternative, Bread/Grain, Fruit, Vegetable, and Milk. Students choosing a fruit or vegetable will get the school lunch pricing. At Breakfast, students are encouraged to take at least 3 of the 4 items offered and 1 item must be a fruit to get the school breakfast price.

In order to make purchases at our cafeterias, each student is given Personal Identification Number (PIN). Students retain this PIN for their duration of time within Neshaminy School District. To help our students remember PINs, those in Grades 1-3 use a swipe card kept in the cafeteria; all other Grades get a paper reminder. Student photographs appear at the register enabling cashiers to validate that students are using correct PINs. In the event that a student forgets their PIN, he/she can get it from the cashier, manager or call the Food Service office at 215-809-6542. All purchases must be confirmed with a PIN. The PIN helps the electronic system manage all school lunch balances including the balances of those on Free and Reduced Lunch Assistance. Borrowing money for lunch is not permitted.

Create an account online at schoolcafe.com to manage and track your child's account by viewing their purchases and add money to their account.

Families can apply for Free and Reduced meals at www.paschoolmeals.co at any time during the school year. If approved, support is provided for the entire school year and 45 days into the following year to allow time to update the application.

Growing Up Mobile iSmart Parenting Cyberbullying Prevention

Working together for safer communities and promoting respectful relationships.



Your best online protection is YOU!

Your knowledge and comfort with digital safety and responsibility will provide a strong basis to support your child as he or she grows into adolescence.

Family guidelines for electronic devices:

- 1.) Strengthen your password and keep it private. Your password and user account name should be kept in a safe place. Share only with a parent/guardian.
- 2.) Never provide your password using email or in response to an email request.
- 3.) Establish family Internet safety rules. Include whether your child can use social networking sites and how your child can use them.
- 4.) The recommended age to sign up for social websites is usually 13 and older. You cannot rely on the services themselves to prevent your underage child from signing up.
- 5.) Evaluate the sites your child plans to use and make sure your child understands the privacy policy and code of conduct.
- 6.) Remind your child to always log in and log out of online accounts.
- 7.) Teach your child to think before posting or sharing information. What seems funny today, might not be funny tomorrow.
- 8.) Realize anything you message or post can be copied, pasted, and sent to other people without your permission.
- 9.) If a site asks your child to submit his/her name to personalize web content, create an online nickname that does not give any personal information.
- 10.) Encourage your child to tell you if something makes him/her feel anxious, uncomfortable, or threatened. Stay calm. Work together to positively resolve the situation.

Questions to ask before sending a message:

- ➔ How private is the message I am sending? Am I willing to have others read this message or forward it without my permission?
- ➔ Am I sending or saying anything that could be considered rude, insulting, or controversial?
- ➔ Do I have permission to forward someone else's messages, photos, or share their personal information?

* Set family safety tools on the medium settings, which should have some limitations to content, websites, and activities.

* Help protect your child from offensive pop-up windows by using the pop-up blocker that is built into Internet Explorer.



A Guide for Students Cyberbullying Prevention

Promoting responsibilities and respect when using electronic devices

If you are cyberbullied:

**STOP!
BLOCK!
TELL!**

1. **STOP!** Take time to calm down.
2. Do not respond to any cyberbullying message.
3. Block the person from contacting you.
4. Do not erase messages.
Save and print screenshots, emails, and text messages.
5. Tell a trusted adult about bullying.
*Keep telling until the adult takes action.
If, necessary, use the evidence to report to web and cell phone service providers.*
6. If you threatened with harm, inform the police.

Don't encourage cyberbullies! If someone you encounter online insults you, **DO NOT REPLY**. If you refuse to respond these is a good chance they will stop. If a cyberbully harasses you through email or instant messaging, you can also use built-in features to prevent further contact.

For Parents and Guardians

If harassment is via email, social networking sites, IM, chat rooms, online gaming:

- Together with your child, or instruct your child, to block the bully
- Or delete your child's account and open a new one
- And/or submit a complaint or report

If harassment is via text or phone messages:

- Change the phone number
→ Instruct your child to only share the new number with trustworthy people
- You may want to investigate phone features that allow a particular number to be blocked

If your child refuses to follow the rules you have established to protect his/her safety and you have attempted to help change his/ her behavior, you can contact the social website your child uses and ask them to remove the page.



"It's the Rule for Back to School."



Pennsylvania law mandates that every child K-12 be immunized on the first day of school.

Vaccination Requirements

For more information on the vaccines your child needs in order to attend school, talk to your healthcare provider or your school nurse.
