We are in year three of our Ready Math program, and we are consistently analyzing data to review student progress and monitor and adjust instruction as appropriate. Curriculum & Instruction also just announced our new program for English Language Arts for the 2023-2024 school year. The decision was based on extensive time staff spent piloting two programs throughout the year and sharing out



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resources and feedback. Thank you to all staff that were involved in this process! HMH: Into Reading will be our new ELA program for students beginning in the fall! We have a great deal of learning taking place behind the scenes to better empower our teachers and staff with comprehensive programs that align with the standards, and we're looking forward to implementation.


Title I News



The PSSA's are coming soon! PSSA stands for Pennsylvania System of School Assessment. The Pennsylvania System of School Assessment is a standardized test administered in public schools in the state of Pennsylvania. Students in grades 3-8 are assessed in English language arts skills and mathematics. The PSSA is a standards-based, criterion-referenced assessment which provides students, parents, educators and the community with an understanding of student and school performance related to the attainment of proficiency of the academic standards.

The PSSA testing window for students in third and fourth grades is above for planning purposes. Please keep these dates in mind when traveling and scheduling activities. Please also support your child by reviewing sample questions in each content area below.


