

Carl Sandburg, Noted Author, Visits New School



Today at the Carl Sandburg Junior High School dedication, they are greatly honored by having Carl Sandburg present. He is an authority on Lincoln, an outstanding poet, novelist, and singer of folk songs.

There are two programs arranged. One, taking place this afternoon, will be for the students only. The second will be in the evening for the parents and teachers. Two thousand people are expected, and will come from places as far as Philadelphia. This performance will be given in the cafeteria where part of the audience will sit. The others will sit in the gym where a closed circuit television, six by eight feet, will televise the program in there.

Mr. Bloom Opens Program

The dedication will not follow the ordinary pattern. Mr. Gerald Bloom will give a brief message, and then the program will be completely turned over to Mr. Sandburg. Mr. David Marrington called this opportunity to meet Carl Sandburg a "rare privilege" that is "all ours."

Carl Sandburg's brother-in-law, Edward Steichen, a world famous photographer, is presenting to C. S. J. H. an eighteen by twenty-four inch enlargement of a mantage of Carl Sandburg. A mantage is a cluster of profiles in different positions and expressions.

Publishers Present Books

Carl Sandburg's publishers are presenting the school a complete set of all he has written.

A special message has been written by Carl Sandburg to the junior high student body. They hope to obtain the original copy.

Last year, Edward R. Murrow interviewed Mr. Sandburg, and C. S. J. H. hopes to receive a tape of that show.

On October 27th, at the Academy of Music, a play called "The World of Carl Sandburg" will be presented. Bette Davis and Gary Merrill will star. The school also hopes to get a copy of the script.

Carl Sandburg was born on January 6, 1879 in Galesburg, Illinois. Until he was thirty-six, Mr. Sandburg was totally unknown. Since then he has written many books, novels and poems.

Three schools bear his name. The Carl Sandburg Elementary School in Harvey, Illinois, the Carl Sandburg High School in Orland Park, Illinois, and the Carl Sandburg Junior High School in Levittown, Pennsylvania. We are very proud to be included in this industrious trio.

Traffic Jams-up

Much progress has been made in the problem of hall jam-ups. The big problem still remaining is the B wing intersection. There are many suggestions as to how these jam-ups can be eliminated. One suggestion is that the school seal should be painted on the floor in the center of B wing intersection. With the idea in mind that we should not walk over the school seal we would have to walk around it.

Students are expected to obey rules and not go to their lockers between periods, only before and after school and before and after lunch. In this way many of the jam-ups in the halls would not exist. If everyone would keep to the right of the corridors, there would be a steady flow of traffic.

The problem of students running and pushing their way through to the cafeteria may be solved by having a student monitor system. The question of the student monitor system we hope will be brought up at the next Student Council meeting.
