A child incarcerated in an adult facility is not a legal resident of the district by such placement, but shall be admitted to the schools of this district and a charge shall be made for tuition in accordance with statute. Resident Legal Guardians The school district shall accept pupils from other areas who make their full-time home in the Neshaminy School District. Before a child is accepted, the person(s) with whom such a child is residing shall file with the Superintendent/ Designee a sworn statement that they are residents of the district, verification that they are supporting the child gratis, that they will assume all personal obligations and responsibilities for the academic achievement and good standing of the child, and that they intend to so keep and support the child continuously and not merely through the school term. The resident must also show cause why the student cannot live with his parents or guardian. Neshaminy School District will forward statements to the proper federal taxing authority. Periodic verification that the child is living in the resident's home on a full-time basis. The resident and natural parent(s) to renew the guardianship status at the beginning of each school year with the Superintendent/Designee, in the administration office. Any student sixteen (16) years old or older have his/her driver's permit or license registered in the resident's address. Cultural Exchange Students With approval of the Superintendent, the school district may accept a non-resident pupil who is classified as a cultural exchange student from a foreign nation and lives with a resident of the school district. Policy 500 (continued) VI. AUTHORITY

Future Residents

A student whose parents have scheduled a settlement date to move into the District after the start of the school year, but prior to the end of the first marking period, will be accepted as a student from the start of the year Without payment of tuition until his/her parents become residents. The parents must supply evidence that they have executed a contract to buy, build, or rent a residence for occupancy in the Neshaminy School District. The Board reserves the right to verify evidence submitted and to remove students from school if evidence cannot be validated. Transportation for these non-resident students will not be provided. If there are unavoidable delays in construction that prevent completion of the home within the required time period, the Superintendent/Designee or designee may visit the construction site to verify the stage of development that would justify or not justify the continued school attendance of the student.

Residents Who Relocate

A resident pupil who ceases to reside within the boundaries of the school district after the beginning of the fourth marking period (after the start of the second semester for seniors only) shall be allowed to finish that school year without payment of tuition, provided that the school building principal recommends continued enrollment. Transportation for these students will not be provided.

A resident pupil enrolled in grades kindergarten through grade 12 who ceases to reside within the boundaries of the school district after the start of the school year must be withdrawn from the Neshaminy School District, unless the parents/guardian of such a student receive permission from the Superintendent/Designee to have the student continue enrollment on a tuition basis.

Parents/guardians requesting continued enrollment on a tuition basis must receive a recommendation from the building principal

Parents/guardians requesting continued enrollment on a tuition basis must make a written request stating same to the Superintendent/Designee. This written request must contain detailed explanations as to why enrollment on a tuition basis is necessary. The Superintendent/Designee will have the authority to grant or deny such requests.

Parents/guardians receiving permission from the Superintendent/Designee to have their child continue enrollment in the Neshaminy School District on a tuition basis will be required to remit the full cost of the tuition before enrollment may be continued.

Transportation for these non-resident tuition students will not be provided by the school district.

In cases of multiple residency, a Parent Residency Affidavit with a notarized seal must be completed by the parent(s) or legal guardian(s) of
