2015-2016 Road Map Update

In 2007, planning for an ambitious 'Road Map' project to modernize both the curriculum and buildings at Neshaminy School District was started. Implementation began during the 2014-2015 school year and continues during the current school year with a number of projects designed to provide the students of Neshaminy a cutting-edge curriculum in updated, safe school buildings all without adding to the tax burden for the residents of the district.

Road Map Goals

- Reduce yearly operating expenses.
- Increase building usage and efficiency.
- Reduce the number of school buildings from12 to 10 to match population trends.
- Improve 7 existing buildings.
- Replace 3 aging elementary school buildings with 1 new school.
- Complete these projects without disrupting classes
- Re-direct building expenses toward investment in educational programs and opportunities for all students.
- Restructure current debt without raising taxes.



Road Map Building Projects Completed

- Major GESA energy-saving building projects at Albert Schweitzer Elementary, Herbert Hoover Elementary and Carl Sandburg Middle School completed during the summer of 2015 added air conditioning, energy-efficient HVAC systems, insulated glass walls, new roofs and other building improvements.
- Fifth grade was transitioned from elementary schools to middle schools in September, 2015. The Bucks County Intermediate Unit is monitoring this change and providing a series of reports during the 2015-2016 school year.
- Construction of the new Tawanka Elementary School in Lower Southampton started in spring, 2015. Construction is on schedule for an August, 2016 opening.
- Samuel Everitt Elementary School closed in June, 2015. The building was leased to the Bucks County Intermediate Unit for 5 years for special needs educational programs.
- Plans for closing Oliver Heckman Elementary School and Lower Southampton Elementary School are under consideration with a final School Board vote taking place in April, 2016. Most, if not all Heckman students and all Lower Southampton students would attend the new Tawanka Elementary School as part of the plan.

Road Map Curriculum Highlights

- Full-day kindergarten classes implemented District-wide in September, 2014.
- The introductory world language program Symtalk was introduced to the fifth grade in September 2015.
- Full foreign language instruction in French and Spanish returned to the eighth grade in September 2015.
- A new developmental reading program was introduced for grades 6-8 during the 2014-2015 school year to support a balanced literacy framework.
- 1:1 iPad Technology program was implemented for the sixth grade in October 2015 and for the fifth grade in December 2015. The iPads will be integrated into every subject area, and the program will expand to 7th
- and 8th grade as the students move ahead during 2016 and 2017.
 Increased STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Math) programs introduced in all grades, including new science programs in the elementary schools, introduction of the Amplify Science pilot program in the sixth grade, new science and computer clubs in elementary and middle schools, and new AP offerings at the high school.
- Expansion of honors-level Project Lead the Way courses at Neshaminy High School, including Introduction to Engineering Design, Principles of Engineering, Digital Electronics and Robotics.
- Debut of the annual District-wide STEM Expo in May 2015 and expansion of the Summer STEM Academy for elementary and middle school students.

Operational Savings and Cost Summaries

March, 2016

The following pages contain general reports on the operational savings gained from the 2015 closure of Samuel Everitt Elementary School, professional staffing expenditures and staff cost savings for the 5-8 Initiative, as well as estimates of operational savings expected from the proposed closure of Oliver Heckman Elementary School and Lower Southampton Elementary School. Except for the renovation estimates, these reports were prepared by the Neshaminy School District Business Office.

The purpose is to provide a general overview of the costs and savings expected from implementation of several portions of current Neshaminy School District Road Map projects. The estimates are based on current salaries, costs and operational needs, and could vary as those factors change.

Operational Savings from the closure of Samuel Everitt Elementary School: Annual savings realized from staff reductions, administrative costs, supplies and textbooks as well as building maintenance and utilities.	\$1,336,764 savings
