### **Parking Lot Procedures . . . Safety First**

Many thanks to all of our Miller parents who are cooperating to make the "Drop Off" and "Pick Up" of our students a safe procedure. Here are some tips to help us make our school parking lot safe for our students, parents, and staff.

- If your child is a busser, please allow him/her to ride the bus. At times of inclement weather, you may "sit" with your child at the bus stop in your car rather than driving him/her to school.
- You have the option of NOT coming into the parking lot. You may drop your child off near the flag pole area on Cobalt Ridge Drive South. There is a crossing guard at this corner, and your child will be safely crossed to the walkway that leads to the school.
- When dropping your child off, avoid the "valet type" drop off. Two cars may "unload" at the same time at the Cafeteria Entrance. If you are "waved through" to the bus port, MANY cars may "unload" at the same time. Our children are certainly capable of walking the few steps to the door. If there is a back-up on Cobalt Ridge Drive South at the LIGHT, consider going RIGHT on Cardinal Road. This road will also lead to Oxford Valley Road.
- If your child is a WALKER, let your child walk! Children enjoy walking together. It is a social experience and allows your child to develop independence while having fun with neighborhood friends and classmates.
- Do NOT double-park in the lot. This just creates additional traffic issues.

## AHERA Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act

"Neshaminy School District has engaged Eagle Industrial Hygiene Assoc., Inc., to fulfill the requirements of the Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act (AHERA), 40 CFR Part 763, Subpart E. This law requires that each Local Education Authority (LEA) engage EPA accredited individuals to initially inspect and subsequently reinspect every three years all student and staff accessed areas for the presence of both friable and nonfriable asbestos containing materials (ACM) and to develop an Asbestos Management Plan from the information developed from the building inspections. All areas of our facilities were inspected for asbestos-containing materials.

The Management Plan provides a description of the amount, type, location and condition of all ACM found in these areas. The Plan also contains a detailed schedule of responses and activities for handling the ACM. The Management Plan is available for review by interested parents, faculty and staff in all school offices during business hours."
