Bandsaw

- Irregular curves
- Ripping
- Crosscutting
- Resawing
- 1. Twisting, binding and pulling are the causes of broken blades
- 2. Keep fingers and hands out of the kerf line at all times.
- 3. No one should stand to the right of the saw while it is running.
- 4. When backing out of a cut, stop the machine to prevent the blade from breaking or being pulled off the drive wheels.
- 5. Small curves should be cut with a thin blade
- 6. Round stock must be clamped in a locking device
- 7. No adjustments are made while the saw is running.
- 8. If the blade breaks, turn the machine off and wait for all moving parts to stop. Notify the instructor.
- 9. Place small pieces in container behind the saw when finished
- 10. The saw guard should be adjusted 1/8" above the wood
- 11. When the saw has stopped, GENTLY lower the saw guide to the table
- 12. Thick lumber must be cut a slow pace.
- 13. Use relief cuts when necessary.
