# Principal's Message...



Dear Parents and Guardians,

With the start of the 4<sup>th</sup> marking period, our attention turns to closing out one school year and planning for the next regarding student placements. This is a process that is determined and reviewed by a team consisting of your child's present homeroom teacher, Reading Specialist, Guidance Counselor, Special Area teacher, and myself. As a team, we make every effort to create classes which reflect a balance of gender, learning styles, behavioral characteristics, academic ability levels, as well as peer relations. As you can well imagine, this is no small task in a school of close to 400 students, and one that the Schweitzer staff takes quite seriously.

As has been past practice here at Albert Schweitzer, in light of this very comprehensive process, I ask that you please do not request special placements to have a particular classroom teacher for next year or for specific friends to be placed together in the same homeroom. In addition, parents are asked to not make requests based on experiences they may have heard about from others regarding a specific teacher. Placements that are based on such requests may not be in the best interest of your child. Just as each child is unique, so are the experiences that each teacher has with the students that they teach from year to year. This policy is made in order to be fair to all Albert Schweitzer families and will allow us as a team to make the decisions which are in the best interest of every student.

Your child's current homeroom teacher has a great deal of input with the class groupings, and will make recommendations for the grouping of the students, but will not identify a specific homeroom teacher for next year for reasons mentioned above. However, if your child should have special or unique needs, such as particular learning environment characteristics, that you feel your child's current homeroom teacher may not be aware of when we create the class lists, please write a letter to me stating those areas that should be taken into account when we make placement decisions for the next year. Parent information about learning needs is considered as part of the classing process, but not the sole factor in deciding placements for next year. Those letters need to be submitted to me by no later than <u>Monday, May 7, 2012</u>. There are a variety of reasons why specific teacher requests may not be granted such as there could be last minute staffing changes over the summer due to retirements, scheduled leave of absences, transfers, classes being added or reduced, etc., which may create openings within our building, as well as in the district that may impact our staffing. Classroom assignments are mailed home on or about August 27<sup>th</sup>, and we need the flexibility up to that date, as students may withdraw or register prior to the opening of school, which is tentatively scheduled for Tuesday September 4, 2012.

On behalf of the entire Albert Schweitzer staff, we appreciate your cooperation, trust and support with this process of making the appropriate placement decisions concerning your child for the upcoming school year.


