Dear Schweitzer Families:

Spring is finally here and with warm weather comes more time outdoors. We are so happy that our students will have the opportunity to spend recess outside in warm, fresh air. They certainly have earned time to relax and enjoy themselves after the tremendous effort they have put forth on the state assessments. I want to take this time to formally commend them, and all of those who helped them perform their best each and every day.

We continue to practice reciprocal teaching strategies with all students, K-5. Every student in the building knows and understands what the Fab 4 strategies are, and how they can access them while they read to strengthen reading comprehension. The strategies are: making predictions, clarifying words they do not know, questioning what is going on in the story or informational text, and summarizing. Needless to say, our K-2 students are only at the beginning stages of learning how to summarize text. Please ask your children how they use these strategies to help them become stronger readers of fiction and non-fiction text. As always, please contact your child's teacher or me if you would like more information on reciprocal teaching and how we have taught it at our school.

The second major professional development theme for the staff at our school is "Effective Feedback." Our teachers choose their language carefully when providing feedback to your children in regard to their work in class, as well as their work habits. For example, instead of saying, "this problem is incorrect," when a student solves a math problem incorrectly, the teacher is more likely to say, "It looks like you are struggling on this one, which strategies have you tried, show me what you do understand, and I will help you with what you still are trying to work out." That way, the teachers will see what is going on as your child is thinking through the problem.

Thank you for sending your children to school on time and ready to work! We appreciate your commitment to excellence. School attendance clearly matters! We are excited to begin the last marking period of the school year refreshed and ready to do great things! Warm regards,

PSSA TESTING


Our PSSA testing kicked off on Tuesday, March 25th for Grades 3, 4 & 5 in Reading and Math
