Dear Parents and Guardians:

The first marking period has swiftly come to a close and student progress reports have been, or will be distributed to you by the end of the month. Conferences have been scheduled and our school is busy with parents and teachers discussing student progress. As I reviewed progress reports, I noted that many students have not mastered math facts. Please continue to impress upon your children the importance of mastering math facts. This is essential in order for the brain to be able to think about problem-solving rather than simple facts. Our goal is to have every student master the math facts identified on the progress reports, by grade, per marking period. We honor each student who reaches this goal by announcing their names over the PA system, and giving them the privilege of signing the "Math Fact Fluency Wall"!

Have your children been talking to you about books they read in school? I love talking to them about their favorite books; they get so excited about the characters and stories. The best way to support your children in reading is to read to, or with, them. Enjoy the great books they are choosing to read and take a few minutes to ask questions you may have about the book. Modeling what you are thinking will help them develop good comprehension skills!

The month of November was a time to reflect on all of which we are thankful. On November 8th, we were fortunate to show our thanks and appreciation to the veterans of this great country. We held a small celebration at school that included speeches from veterans who have served our country, patriotic poems read by students, and classroom doors displaying decorative homage to the men and women who have risked their lives to ensure our freedom. 
We ask that all students do their personal best every day and that they work hard to meet that expectation.

STRING DAY


