On Friday, November 21st our kindergarten students in Ms. Supowitz's class were treated to scarecrow cookies and other treats during their Fall Festival






## **Holiday Feast**

#### PROPER DRESS ATTIRE:

Please be sure that your child is dressed appropriately for school, as they will be going outside for recess in the colder weather. Hats, gloves, jackets will all help keep your child warm.

#### **COLD AND FLU SEASON**

Cold and Flu season is approaching. In order to help keep everyone healthy here are guidelines to follow:
