Principal's Message

Dear Albert Schweitzer Families:

The beautiful weather is an indication that the summer months are upon us and the school year is about to come to a close. It has been an exciting year for our students, and I would like to take the time to take you "down memory lane" as we reflect on our accomplishments this year.

Our school was the only elementary school in the district to fully implement the new math curriculum, "Math in Focus," at all grade levels. Every one of our students has experienced the new, rigorous curriculum, and we are pleased to say that they are beginning to change the way they think about mathematics. With great thanks to the district math coach for the elementary schools, Mrs. Shelley Rosen, our teachers were fully prepared to implement the program and assess how well our students were acquiring basic and problem-solving skills. The Smartboards were very instrumental in providing students with the visual representation of concepts, and on that note, I would like to announce that by the start of the new school year, every classroom teacher will have a Smartboard in their room.

Our primary grade students continue to work within a balanced literacy model that includes the "Superkids" program, as well as "Kid writing" in kindergarten, and Readers/Writers workshop in grades I and 2. Our literacy specialist, Mrs. Nicole Mascione, worked with teachers and students on the overall theme, "Reading is Thinking," and we have seen a marked improvement in the way students are approaching texts. They are more deeply engaged in reading both fiction and non-fiction text. Next year, our reading comprehension initiative will include professional development on the strategy, "reciprocal teaching." It is a constructivist view of the reading process whereby "ownership" of reading gradually moves from the teacher to the students. If you would like to learn more about reciprocal teaching and how we plan to implement it next year, please give me a call. I like nothing more than to discuss how children learn to read!

Our students experienced many amazing class trips this year, such as the Philadelphia Zoo, The Franklin Institute, William Penn Manor, The Academy of Natural Sciences, Independence Hall, The Please Touch Museum and the AMC Theater. Thank you to the teachers who planned the trips, and the parents/guardians who chaperoned the trips; we greatly appreciate it!

Thank you to Mrs. Exner for taking the lead on our greenhouse projects. She and the 3rd grade teachers partnered with the Middletown Senior Center to grow herbs for donation. We are working on building the idea of civic responsibilities in our community. We have many exciting plans for community service next year. If you have any ideas that you would like to share, please contact me over the summer.

In closing, I would like to say a final farewell to four fabulous teachers who will be retiring at the end of this school year. Mrs. Notwick, Mrs. Scherf, Mrs. Murdock and Mrs. Warwick-Canning have served our school community to "exemplary" status! They are going to be missed dearly, but we wish them a fruitful, happy retirement, and hope that they know they have left an indelible mark on the Albert Schweitzer Elementary School community.

I wish all of you a relaxing summer! Please encourage your children to read great books over the summer and to look for mathematical concepts...."everywhere!"

Greenhouse Community Service Project








As a special "Community Service Project," Mrs. Exner 's Life Skills class, along with our third grade students, grew starter vegetable plants in our school's greenhouse.

Fresh soft pretzel treats were awarded to the winning classrooms.






















COME VISIT THE FIRST GRADE ZOO!!!
