## Principal's Message...



September, 2013

Dear Parents/Guardians:

Welcome back to school! It is so exciting to know that your children will be back at school in just a few short weeks. We thought about them all summer and hoped that they were reading wonderful stories, writing in their notebooks, and finding math problems to solve! We try hard, as I know you do, to foster the idea that learning is everywhere and that no day should go without learning something new.

Our first day of school for students is Monday, September 9<sup>th</sup>, and the building will be *sparkling clean* and ready to receive our students and staff. I would like to thank Mr. Brian Sutter and our fabulous summer custodial staff for the first-rate job they have been doing getting our school ready for the start of school. I would also like to thank our office staff, Mrs. DiPaolo and Mrs. Donaldson, for their support and hard work during the summer. I am grateful to everyone who helped to make the first day of school a successful one for our students and staff.

As part of the final stages of technology upgrades in the district, our school is scheduled to have Smart Boards installed in kindergarten and I<sup>st</sup> grade classrooms, as well as the library. All 2<sup>nd</sup> through 5<sup>th</sup> grade classrooms had Smart Boards installed over the past two years. We expect the installation to be completed by mid-September. We also will have classroom sets of Netbooks, laptops, and, at least one set of iPads for student use.

Additionally, we purchased six *iPads* with the money that was collected at our "Tech Trot" last spring. Thank you to Mr. Krauss and the PTO for spearheading the fundraiser. We look forward to making it an annual tradition at our school!

I am not sure if you heard about our school being awarded a \$15,000 grant for technology! Congratulations to our primary life skills teacher, Mrs. JoEllen Exner, for writing an exceptional grant application that secured the technology for our students. We will be receiving a Smart Table, Smart Board and other technologies to support student learning.

We will continue to foster C.A.R.E.S. behavior at our school and follow the same school-wide positive behavior system. In addition to that, we will be adding another layer to our positive behavioral theme: "Attendance Matters. Get Here, Get Smart." We know that we have our best opportunity to provide your child with a consistent, exceptional education when they are at school every day. However, we certainly understand that children get sick, so please adhere to the school nurse's recommendations regarding times that it would be prudent to keep your child home from school.

As I noted in my last newsletter, we had four teacher retirements last year: Mrs. Notwick, Mrs. Murdock, Mrs. Scherf and Mrs. Warwick-Canning. We also received word that Ms. Gabage, our general music and choral teacher, accepted a position in her home district. We will miss them, but we wish them well in their new endeavors. I have spent a good deal of my time interviewing teachers this summer and will announce the names of our new art and music teachers as soon as we receive school board approval on August 27, 2013.

I know that you and your child are anxiously waiting to know their classroom assignment. You can start accessing your child's classroom assignment, bus information, etc., via "Home Access" on the website. The system should be open for your convenience at the end of the month. If you have misplaced your access information, please call our office and we will provide you with the password.

Our Back-to-School Night is scheduled for Thursday, September 26<sup>th</sup> from 6:45 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. There will be an opening session with the PTO, followed by two sessions with classroom teachers, and a final session with special area teachers, such as: art, music, library, and physical education. We all look forward to seeing you that evening.

Finally, I would like to invite all of you to join our PTO this year. We can all do something, big or small, to help make a difference at our school. Our PTO president, Mrs. Claudia Phillippe, and members of the executive board, will be joining us at our Kindergarten and New Student Orientation on August 27th. They will also be doing a presentation at 6:45 p.m. at our Back-to-School Night. Please inquire about ways you can support the events that have been planned for your children this year!

## **Eagle Industrial Hygiene Associates**

"Neshaminy School District has engaged Eagle Industrial Hygiene Association, Inc., to fulfill the requirements of the Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act (AHERA), 40 CFR Part 763, Subpart E. This law requires that each Local Education Authority (LEA) engage EPA accredited individuals to initially inspect and subsequently re-inspect every three years all student and staff accessed areas for the presence of both friable and non-friable asbestos containing materials (ACM) and to develop and Asbestos Management Plan from the information developed from the building inspections. All areas of our facilities were inspected for asbestos-containing materials.

The Management Plan provides a description of the amount, type, location and condition of all ACM found in these areas. The Plan also contains a detailed schedule of responses and activities for handling the ACM. The Management Plan is available for review by interested parents, faculty and staff in all school offices during business hours.
