Principal's Message...

February 2014

Dear Parents/Guardians:

This has been an interesting month of wintry weather. The artic temperatures and snowy days have kept our students indoors for weeks at a time. It has also meant that school has been cancelled or delayed. With those issues in mind, I would like to give you an overview of the on-line curriculum support programs that are available to you and your children. Please take a few minutes to review the list and encourage your child to work on the ones they need to improve their skills. These are ways your child can still work on their skills, even when they are not in school!

Dream Box: (Grades K-2) Dream Box is an online math program designed to help students build their math confidence and ability. Dream Box is an independent activity that is tailored to your child's learning so it is imperative that you encourage them to play on their own, without the help from another student or adult. Your child should play on Dream Box at least two-three times per week for thirty minutes. Your child's teacher may assign this as homework as well. Contact your child's teacher if you have not received login information.

To access Dream Box from home, please go to: https://httplay.dreambox.com/login/yztw from here you will select your child's school. Please note that some schools have two links, only one is active for this school year. After selecting your child's school, then click on their teacher's email address. This will take you to a page to log your child in. Students in grades K-2 will select their name and then a picture icon. Students in grades 3-5 will enter a username (typically first name/last initial) and a password that the teacher has provided.

Think Central: (Grades K-5) Think Central is online access to your child's textbook, workbook and virtual manipulatives for Math In Focus. These resources are provided to students and parents to support the learning in the classrooms by reviewing information or making up lessons due to absences from school. Please do not work ahead of your child's teacher. If you have not received login information for Think Central, please contact your child's teacher.

Math Buddies: (Grades 3-5) Math Buddies is another online resource to your child's math curriculum. The Math Buddies program provides online tutorials, scaffolded practice problems and assessments for each math skill. This has been a valuable classroom tool for both students and teachers as Math In Focus has been introduced into our schools. Student accounts provide access to class assignments for extra practice and/or to make up missed work due to absences. This program will also provide students with opportunities to preview upcoming skills and topics as well as review lessons learned in class. All pieces of the Math Buddies program will be available for home use including the tutorial videos and extra practice pages. Additionally, parents can use the Math Buddies program as an in-home demonstration of the material being taught in class to help support their children at home.

Your child's teacher has been given the account information for each student in his/her class. If you have not received this information yet, please contact your child's teacher. To access the Math Buddies website, please go to the following page: http://www.mymathbuddies.com. From there you will enter your child's login information which will provide access to teacher provided assignments and course materials. First In Math: (Grades K-5) First In Math is an online fact fluency program that encourages each child to continually strive towards the next level. The program encourages friendly completion between students and other classrooms. It promotes teamwork and collaboration within the school and at home. First In Math can be accessed from any computer with internet access. Your child should have received login information from his or her teacher. Please visit the following website for more information and to allow your child to login: http://www.firstinmath.com.

Super Kids Online Fun: (Grades K-2) SuperKids Online Fun is the website students use to play online games and read interactive books and magazines. The interactive games, books and magazines that are available to your children coordinate with classroom instruction. As teachers manage the settings when they begin a new unit library books, magazines and reader stories will appear for children in Superkids Online Fun. Children will be able to play online games at home after you have completed the set-up process for your parent portal account. This information is sent to you automatically after your teacher enters your e-mail address into their class roster. Super Kids is also available on iPad and other mobile devices.

Kindergarten: online games, interactive library books

<u>First grade:</u> interactive decodable readers, Super-Duper mini-magazines, library books and online games <u>Second Grade:</u> Interactive decodable readers, Super magazines and backpack pages

You can launch Superkids Online fun through the Parent Portal at www.superkidsonline.org. The content will be much the same as what your child sees when they play at school with the following differences:

<u>No student log-in:</u> Children will not need to select their name and picture passwords at home. No data reporting: Games that are played at home are not reported.

<u>Delayed content release</u>: In the parent portal, interactive decodable reader stories and magazines issues will be released a unit later than they are introduced in the program. This is to ensure children do not read stories and articles at home before they have been covered in class.

<u>Summer Access</u>: Students will have full access to the games and books in Superkids Online Fun over the summer through the parent portal.

Raz Kids: (Grades K-5) RAZ-Kids is an interactive reading tool for our students to practice reading fluency and comprehension. Each student should have received a log in and a password from their teacher to get into their Raz Kids account. Your child's teacher is able to monitor the students' progress and change their reading level. These levels are all individually based on each child's performance and are adjusted to reflect their abilities. The students can listen to a story, read a story out loud, record themselves reading, and then take a comprehension quiz. Each child earns points or stars to use for their RAZ Rocket which allows them to buy things for their rocket!

To register for Raz Kids please go to the website at http://raz-kids.com/login. For student login, they only need to click on their name and enter their password. From here they have access to all of the resources listed above. For parent login, please click on your student's name. When the page loads please click on "Parent" in the top right corner. Then click on "Register" on the left side of the screen. You will be prompted to enter a valid email address and click "OK." The program will then email you a unique password to the email that you provided. You must then login using that email and the provided password. You may change the password once you login to the account.

Again, please encourage your child to access these resources to help them achieve their learning goals!


GROUNDHOG DAY-SATURDAY, FEBRUARY 2, 2014
