29		education, is the greatest instrument for preserving, and perpetuating				
30		our representative democracy.				
31		2. The future welfare of this community, commonwealth and nation				
32		depends upon the quality of education we provide in the public

34		3. In order to maintain a free and strong country, our civic obligation to				
35		the community, commonwealth and nation is to maintain free and				
36		strong public schools in the United States of America, without				
37		surrendering our responsibilities to any other person, group or
