

Read 180 and the Five Reading Components

Read 180 is an intensive reading intervention program for students in grades 3-12. It provides daily reading, writing, and vocabulary instruction. The Read 180 classroom is divided into the following instructional model:

Whole Group Instruction

Using the Anchor Video:

- Building background knowledge
- Enriching oral language development
- Building and enhancing vocabulary
- Using graphic organizers to promote higher order thinking
- Forming opinions based on evidence

Using the rBook to read, react, and respond

- Vocabulary acquisition and enhancement
- Comprehension development of skills and strategies
- Fluency building
- Writing- using the writing process and developing strategies/skills for open-ended responses
- Differentiated lesson that includes: phonemic awareness, phonics, fluency, grammar, and spelling





Software Rotation

Reading Zone

- Vocabulary- master vocabulary
- Comprehension- develop and apply comprehension strategies
- Fluency

Word Zone

- Phonemic awareness
- Phonics
- Structural analysis
- Spelling
- Vocabulary
- Automaticity with word recognition/word fluency

Spelling Zone

- Spelling- develop and apply spelling and proofreading skills
- Vocabulary
- Proofreading skills

Success Zone

- Comprehension
- Vocabulary
- Fluency of passage reading

- Independent practice of writing process
 - o Organize
 - o Write
 - o Review
 - o Edit
- Think critically to establish a point of view

- Build and practice comprehension skills and strategies
- Expand writing skills through journal writing and Quick Writes
