geography - the study of Earth's land, water, air, and people

prime meridian: the imaginary line that divides Earth into the Eastern and Western hemispheres

country - an area of land that has its own government border - the line where one place ends and another begins

In 1776, people in North America formed a new country. The country was called the United States.


Two explorers traveled West to explore more land. Their names were Lewis and Clark.


They traveled across the United States to the Pacific Ocean and back. They were heroes.
