cardinal directions - one of four main directions: north, east, south, and west

<u>2.1 The 50 States p. 18</u>

There are 50 states in the United States. We live in Pennsylvania. There are communities in every state. Our community is called Levittown.



2.2 The Statue of Liberty p. 19



The famous statue welcomes people to the United States. It stands for freedom. It is called the Statue of Liberty. It is on a small island in New York City. It is near the Atlantic Ocean.

2.3 The Everglades p. 20

The Everglades are warm and wet. Lots of birds, snakes, crocodiles, and alligators live there. People visit the Everglades to camp, to see wildlife, and to fish.

The Everglades are in the state of Florida.



2.4 Mount Rushmore p. 21

Mount Rushmore shows the faces of four famous U.S. presidents. The faces are 60 feet high. It took 14 years to carve them.

Mount Rushmore is in the state of South Dakota. South Dakota is west of the Mississippi River. It is east of the Rocky Mountains.



2.5 The Grand Canyon p. 22

grand - large canyon - a deep, narrow valley with steep sides

A river runs along the bottom of the Grand Canyon. The Grand Canyon is in the state of Arizona.



2.6 The Golden Gate Bridge p. 23

The Golden Gate Bridge crosses the entrance to San Francisco Bay. The bridge opened in 1937. It had the tallest towers of any bridge in the world.

The city of San Francisco is at the south end of the bridge. People cross the bridge to get to other parts of the state of California.

tradition - something that people do together year after year

symbol - an object that stands for something else (for example, the Liberty Bell, American flag, and American Eagle are symbols of freedom)

The Liberty Bell is in the city of Philadelphia. People rang it in 1776. They were going to read the Declaration of Independence out loud. They wanted everyone to come and hear it being read.

The flag stands for our strength and for everything that makes us one country. The Liberty Bell stands for freedom.
