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6	II. DEFINITIONS	Weapon - the term shall include but not be limited to any knife, cutting	6
7		instrument, cutting tool, nunchaku, firearm, shotgun, rifle, and/or any other	7

9		"Look alike" or replicas of weapons will be treated as a "weapon" for	9
10		purposes of this Board Policy.	10
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12		<b>Possessing</b> - a student is in possession of a weapon when the weapon is found	12
13		on the person of the student; in the student's locker; under the student's	13
14		control while s/he is on school property, on property being used by the school,	14
15		at any school function or activity, at any school event held away from the	15
16		school; or while the student is on his/her way to or from school.	16
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18	III. AUTHORITY	The Board prohibits students from possessing weapons in any school district	18
19	SC 1317.2	buildings, on school property, in any school-sponsored activity, and on any	19
20		vehicle provided by the district providing transportation to or from school or	20
21		a school-sponsored activity.	21

23		Any student who possesses, uses or transfers a weapon on school property or	23
24		during a school function shall be expelled for a	24
25		period of not less than one year in accordance with applicable law. Such	25
26		expulsion shall comply with the formal due process proceedings required by	26
27		law. The Superintendent may recommend modifications to an expulsion on a	27
28		case-by-case basis.	28
